Crochet Pattern by **Ravennagurumi**

This pdf contains the full pattern, some pictures to guide you, a list of materials you will need, and a list of abbreviations used.

This Pattern is based on **Grub**, one of the main characters of Hollow Knight, a Metroidvania videogame developed and published by Team Cherry in 2017.

Materials and tools

- Medium green, light green, ivory and black yarns.
- White yarn (optional)
- Crochet hook
- Sewing needle
- Stuffing material
- Row marker
- Pins
- Scissors



This amigurumi is crocheted with “Gala” yarn, fabric by Hilaturas L.M., that is 100% acrylic, 320m/80g. The hook used is a 2.75mm clover hook. And the stuffing material used in this amigurumi is 100% polyester fiber.

The result may vary depending on the thickness of the yarn and the size of the hook. I advise you to use a smaller hook than the label recommends and to crochet with tight stitches, to be sure that there aren't any holes between stitches.

Terms

MR = Magic ring

SC = Single crochet

INC = Increase

DEC = Invisible decrease

HDC = Half double crochet

To avoid seams and unevenness, some crocheted parts are made in a spiral technic, working without slip stitch and chains between rows. For this reason, is possible that you lose the beginning of the row. To avoid this, use a row marker, or a thread of other color.

Because of use this technic, all these details must be finished with a slip stitch and a chain for joining both rows without uneven edges.

Ultimately, for completing this amigurumi, you'll need to know one of the color change techniques.

Pattern

Head and body

Make one alternating medium green and light green (or mint) yarns (images 1 & 2). Medium green stitches will be written normally, and light green stitches will be written underlined.

Example: medium green stitch – light green stitch.

Start crocheting in medium green:

1. MR 6 sc (6)
2. 6 inc (12)
3. (1 sc, 1 inc) x6 (18)
4. (2 sc, 1 inc) x6 (24)
5. (3 sc, 1 inc) x6 (30)
6. 30 sc (30)
7. 30 sc (30)
8. 30 sc (30)
9. 30 sc (30)
10. 30 sc (30)
11. (3 sc, 1 dec) x6 (24)
12. (2 sc, 1 dec) x6 (18)
13. (1 sc, 1 dec) x6 (12)
14. 5 inc, 2 inc, 5 inc (24)
15. 10 sc, 4 sc, 10 sc (24)
16. 10 sc, 4 sc, 10 sc (24)
17. 10 sc, 4 sc, 10 sc (24)
18. 5 dec, 2 dec, 5 dec (12)
19. 5 inc, 2 inc, 5 inc (24)
20. 10 sc, 4 sc, 10 sc (24)
21. 10 sc, 4 sc, 10 sc (24)
22. 10 sc, 4 sc, 10 sc (24)
23. 5 dec, 2 dec, 5 dec (12)
24. 6 dec (6)

Stuff firmly. Cut the thread and tighten all stitches on front loops only using a sewing needle (images 3, 4 & 5).

Legs

Make six with medium green yarn (image 6).

1. MR 8 sc (8)
2. 8 sc (8)

Fasten off leaving a long thread for sewing.

Stuff slightly.

Tail

Make one with medium green yarn (image 7).

The first part of the tail is curved. In order to obtain this curve you have to crochet the usual rows and a special kind of rows where you have to leave free the main thread (the thread which you use to start the magic ring), and join a new thread for crocheting some stitches in a “short row”, leaving incomplete the entire row. And then, continue working as usual in all the stitches that you can see: new stitches of the incomplete row and stitches of the previous row (images 8 – 14):

1. MR 6 sc (6)
2. Take the main thread loop off the hook and safe it using a stitch marker if you want. Join a new thread in the first stitch of the row and crochet 3 sc (3), fasten off.
3. Pick up the main thread and crochet 6 sc (6)
4. Take the main thread loop off the hook. Join a new thread in the first stitch of the row and crochet 3 sc (3), fasten off.
5. Pick up the main thread and crochet 6 sc (6), continue working normally
6. (2 sc, 1 inc) x2 (8)
7. 8 sc (8)
8. 1 inc, 4 sc, 3 inc (12)
9. 12 sc (12)
10. 1 sc, 1 inc, 6 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x2 (15)

Fasten off leaving a long thread for sewing. Stuff firmly.

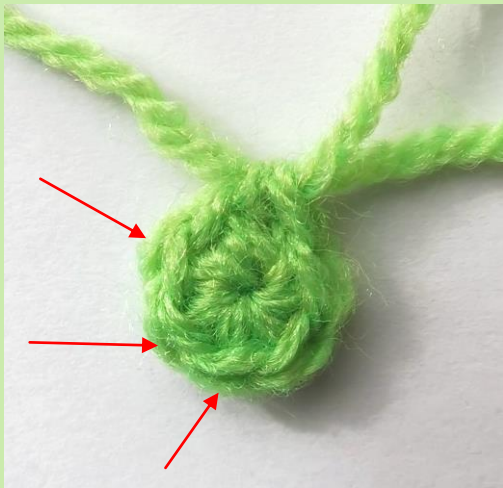

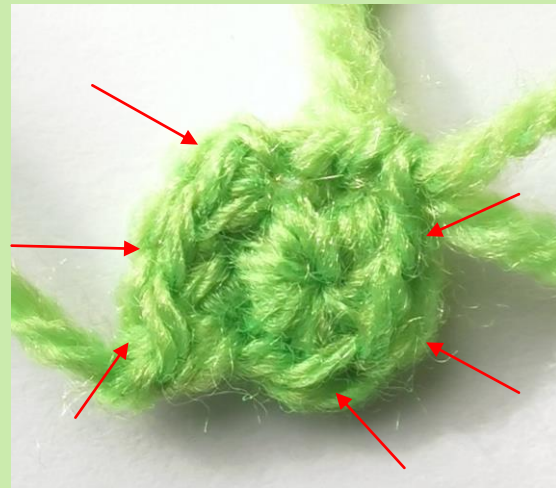

Mouth

Make one with ivory yarn (image 15).

This piece is curved too. So you have to use the same technic that you used to crochet the tail: You have to crochet the usual rows and a special kind of rows where you have to leave free the main thread (the thread which you use to start the magic ring), and join a new thread for crocheting some stitches in a “short row”, leaving incomplete the entire row. And then, continue working as usual in all the stiches that you can see: new stitches of the incomplete row and stitches of the previous row (images 16 – 22):

1. MR 6 sc (6)
2. 6 sc (6)
3. Take the main thread loop off the hook and safe it using a stitch marker if you want. Join a new thread in the first stitch of the row and crochet 3 sc (3), fasten off.
4. Pick up the main thread and crochet 6 sc (6)

5. Take the main thread loop off the hook. Join a new thread in the first stitch of the row and crochet 3 sc (3), fasten off.
6. Pick up the main thread and crochet 6 sc (6)
7. Take the main thread loop off the hook. Join a new thread in the first stitch of the row and crochet 3 sc (3), fasten off.
8. Pick up the main thread and crochet 6 sc (6)
9. Take the main thread loop off the hook. Join a new thread in the first stitch of the row and crochet 3 sc (3), fasten off.
10. Pick up the main thread and crochet 6 sc (6), continue working normally
11. 6 sc (6)

Stuff firmly. Cut the thread and tighten all stitches on front loops only using a sewing needle (images 23 – 27).

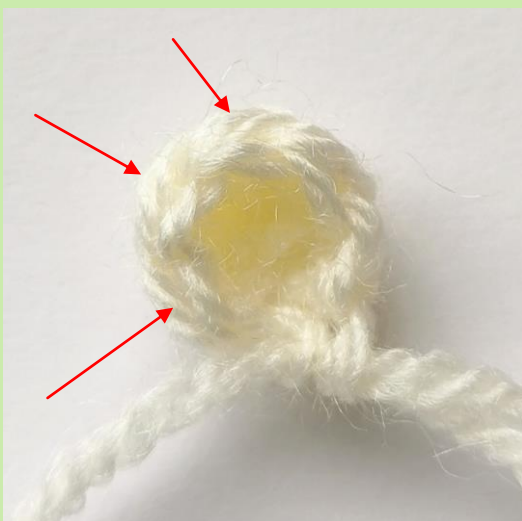

Eyes

Make two pieces with black yarn (image 28).

1. MR 1 sc, 2 hdc, 2 sc, 2 hdc, 1 sc (8)

Cut the thread leaving a long thread for sewing and close the magic ring. Fasten off using a sewing needle. Join the last stitch and the first stitch of the row (images 29, 30, 31, 32 & 33). Joining both stitches you should have an oval shaped eye.

Assembly

Once you have crocheted all the pieces it's time to sew all of them and finish the amigurumi. Before sewing you should place all parts with pins to check the perfect location for them. When you are okay with the position of every piece, start sewing!

Once you have finished sewing, tie the remaining strands together in pairs; and hide the thread inside the body.

Although you can sew the different parts of the amigurumi like you prefer. Below I'm going to explain the sewing order that can be easier.

First step: Unite the legs to the body sewing it. Place the legs on both sides of the tummy that we have crocheted in light green yarn. It is advisable to sew them in pairs, but you can place them all using pins to check the perfect placement (images 34, 35 & 36).

Second step: Sew the tail to the lower part of the back. Be sure the toy stands by itself (images 37, 38 & 39).

Third step: Attach the mouth to the head. The upper part of the mouth should be place between 7th and 8th rows. Be sure that the mouth is centered between the legs (images 40, 41 & 42).

Fourth step: sew the eyes on both sides of the mouth (images 43, 44, 45 & 46).

Fifth step: once you sew the eyes, you can add white pupils or the eye shine, just if you want you Grub even more adorable (image 47). You can embroider these pupils using a sewing needle and making a French knot and regular stitches. But, of course, you can embroider them using the technic that you prefer.

Once you have finish sewing and all the parts are attached, it's time to tie the remaining strands together in pairs and hide the threads inside de body.
