Read Carefully

Pay attention to the details!

Look carefully at the images and links to supporting videos that are available. If you encounter difficulties, don't hesitate to talk to me, and don't be afraid to start a piece over again.

Make your amigurumi in the order in which it is in the pattern, but make sure you look through all the pages before you start!

Tips and Tutorials

You will find throughout this pattern some QR Codes that will direct you to videos and tutorials on YouTube. If you use the printed pattern, just point your cell phone's camera at the QR Code. If you use the digital file, just click on the QR Code and it will open the respective tutorial on YouTube.

I post new tips on the channel every week, based on the questions you send me.

I also created the Playlist "Crochet Dictionary" and you can find a brief explanation of all the stitches I use in making my amigurumis.

Yarn under or Yarn over?

I make my amigurumis with a yarn under technique because it tends to make the stitches more closed, and the piece is a little smaller. Don't worry if you prefer to do the yarn over, as the pattern works perfectly with both types of stitches (including the square head!). The hair of the amigurumis is the only part that I usually don't tighten my stitches so much, as I prefer to leave them looser.

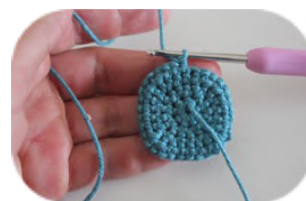


Crochet using the usual side

I'm right-handed, and my amigurumis are made counterclockwise. If you are a beginner and have difficulty visualizing which side is the inside and which is the outside of the piece, see the Images below: It is very important to understand the reverse side (inside) of the magic ring for the correct positioning of the amigurumi.

Stitch marker

I always place the stitch marker on the first stitch of the round, i.e. the marker indicates the **start** of each round.



Abbreviations

Rnd	Round
St	Stitch
Sl st	Slip stitch
Sc	Single crochet
Flo	Front loops only
Blo	Back loops only
Inc	Increase
Inc3	Triple Increase
Inc4	4sc Increase
Dec	Decrease

Dimensions

Using a 2.0 mm hook and with my grip, he ended 10 cm tall. This size may vary depending on the yarn chosen, how tight your stitches are and the hook of your choice.

Difficulty level

This pattern is an intermediate level, requiring the artisan to know how to perform the basic stitches.

How to read the Pattern

Example: **Rnd 3: (2 sc, 1 inc) x 6 [24]**

You must do the sequence in parentheses 6 times.

As the **inc** results in **2 stitches**, we will end up with **24 sc**.

Materials

Hook: 2.0 mm Tulip Crochet Hook.

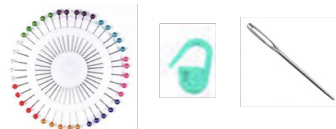
Yarn: All yarns used are 100% cotton, and of similar thickness. You can use yarn from other brands in these colors.

The colors used for this toy were Aquamarine (25), Blue Jeans (26), Blue (27) and Lobelia (82) from DMC Natura Just Cotton. Also color Pistacchio (108) from Hobbii Friends 4/8.



Accessories: In addition to the pins, you will need tapestry needle, stitch marker and synthetic fiber to fill the amigurumi.

The eyes used for this amigurumi are 16 mm.





Head

Use the color Blue Jeans. The color changes to Aquamarine (to make the eyes) will be highlighted in **light blue** to make them easier to see.

Rnd 1: 8 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: 8 inc [16]

Rnd 3: (1 sc, 1 inc) x 8 [24]

Rnd 4: (3 sc, 1 inc) x 6 [30]

Rnd 5: 2 sc, 1 inc, (4 sc, 1 inc) x 5, 2 sc [36]

Rnd 6: (5 sc, 1 inc) x 6 [42]

Rnd 7: 3 sc, 1 inc, (6 sc, 1 inc) x 5, 3 sc [48]

Rnd 8: (7 sc, 1 inc) x 6 [54]

Rnd 9: 54 sc

Rnd 10: 20 sc, **3 sc**, 8 sc, **3 sc**, 20 sc [54]

Rnd 11: 19 sc, **5 sc**, 6 sc, **5 sc**, 19 sc [54]

Rnd 12 - 13: 18 sc, **6 sc**, 6 sc, **6 sc**, 18 sc [54]
(2 rounds)

Rnd 14 - 15: 17 sc, **7 sc**, 6 sc, **7 sc**, 17 sc [54]
(2 rounds)

Rnd 16 - 17: 16 sc, **8 sc**, 6 sc, **8 sc**, 16 sc [54]
(2 rounds)

Rnd 18 - 19: 17 sc, **7 sc**, 6 sc, **7 sc**, 17 sc [54]
(2 rounds)

Rnd 20: 54 sc

Insert the eyes between **rounds 17 and 18**. Note in the Images that the eye should be inserted **3 sc** of the light blue color towards the center of the piece (Image 5).
Add stuffing as you close the piece.

Rnd 21: (7 sc, 1 dec) x 6 [48]

Rnd 22: 16 sc, **16 sc**, 16 sc [48]

Rnd 23: 2 sc, 1 dec, (4 sc, 1 dec) x 2,
(4 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 4 sc, 1 dec,
(4 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 2 sc [40]

Rnd 24: (3 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 3 sc, **1 dec**,
(3 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 2 sc, 1 sc, 1 dec,
(3 sc, 1 dec) x 2 [32]

Rnd 25: 1 sc, 1 dec, (2 sc, 1 dec) x 2,
(2 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 1 sc, 1 dec,
(2 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 2 sc [24]

Rnd 26: (1 sc, 1 dec) x 8 [16]

Rnd 27: 8 dec [8]

Finish off with the inverted magic ring.

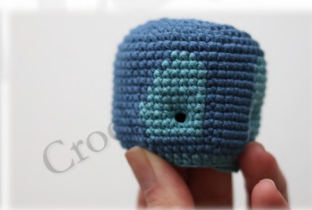

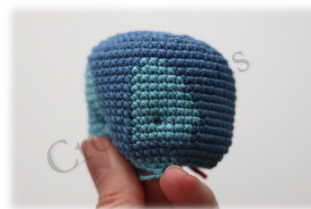

Body

Use color Blue Jeans. The color changes to Aquamarine (to make the eyes) will be highlighted in **light blue** to make them easier to see.

Rnd 1: 8 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: 8 inc [16]

Rnd 3: (1 sc, 1 inc) x 8 [24]

Rnd 4: 1 sc, 1 inc, (2 sc, 1 inc) x 7, 1 sc [32]

Rnd 5: (3 sc, 1 inc) x 8 [40]

Rnd 6: 40 sc

Rnd 7: 17 sc, **3 sc**, 20 sc [40]

Rnd 8: 16 sc, **5 sc**, 19 sc [40]

Rnd 9: 15 sc, **7 sc**, 18 sc [40]

Rnd 10: 14 sc, **9 sc**, 17 sc [40]

Rnd 11: 8 sc, 1 dec, 3 sc, **5 sc**, **1 dec**, **4 sc**,
4 sc, 1 dec, 8 sc, 1 dec [36]

Rnd 12 - 16: 12 sc, **10 sc**, 14 sc [36] (5 rounds)

Leave a long thread for sewing.

Paws

Use color Blue.

Rnd 1: 8 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: Change to Blue Jeans. 8 inc [16]

Rnd 3: 6 sc, 4 inc, 6 sc [20]

Rnd 4: **Blo** 20 sc

Rnd 5: 20 sc

Rnd 6: 6 sc, 4 dec, 6 sc [16]

Rnd 7: 16 sc

Leave a long thread for sewing.

Tail

Use color Blue Jeans.

Rnd 1: 8 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: 8 inc [16]

Rnd 3: (3 sc, 1 inc) x 4 [20]

Rnd 4: 20 sc

Rnd 5: (3 sc, 1 dec) x 4 [16]

Leave a long thread for sewing.

Snout

Use color Blue.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: (inc3, 1 sc) x 3 [12]

Rnd 3: 1 sc, inc3, (3 sc, inc3) x 2, 2 sc [18]

Rnd 4: 18 sc

Leave a long thread for sewing.



Attention!

An **inc3** means a triple increase, that is, **3 sc** made in the same stitch.

Arms

Use color Blue and make two pieces.

Rnd 1: 8 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: Change to Blue Jeans. 8 inc [16]

Rnd 3: **Blo** 16 sc

Rnd 4: 16 sc

Rnd 5: (6 sc, 1 dec) x 2 [14]

Rnd 6 - 7: 14 sc (2 rounds)

Rnd 8: (5 sc, 1 dec) x 2 [12]

Rnd 9 - 10: 12 sc (2 rounds)

Stuff the arm halfway. Pinch the piece close and make **6 sc** to close it. Leave a long thread for sewing.

Hair

Use color Blue Jeans. Follow the sequence of instructions and Images exactly as shown below.

Make **4 chains** and in the second chain from the hook, make **1 sc** (this is the base of the piece).

Make **4 chains** and make **3 sc**.

Make **1 sl st** in the same **sc** of the base.

Make **4 chains** and make **3 sc**. Make **1 sl st** in the same **sc** of the base, **sc** in the next chain.

Leave a long thread for sewing.

Make **5 chains** and make **4 sc**. Make **1 sl st** in the same **sc** of the base, **sc** in the next chain.

Right Ear

Make two identical pieces, one in Blue Jeans and the other in Lobelia.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: 1 sc, inc4, 2 sc, inc4, 1 sc [12]

Rnd 3: 1 sc, 3 inc, 3 sc, 3 inc, 2 sc [18]

Rnd 4: 1 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 3 sc,
(1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 2 sc [24]

Rnd 5: 1 sc, (2 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 3 sc,
(2 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 2 sc [30]

Rnd 6: 3 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 3 sc.

Cut the yarn, and attach it again to the next stitch. The idea is to create a hole for Stitch's ear to be cut.

6 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 6 sc [36]

Rnd 7: 6 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 3 sc.

Cut the yarn, and attach it again at the next stitch.

9 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 6 sc [42]

Rnd 8: 7 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 5 sc

Cut the yarn, and attach it again at the next stitch.

12 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 6 sc [48]

Finish off the pink piece and do not finish off the blue piece.

Place the pink piece in front of the blue one and with the blue yarn make **sc** around the entire ear, joining the two pieces. Finish off.

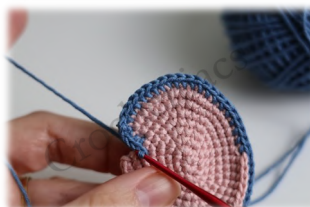

Attention!

An **inc4** means a triple increase, that is, **4 sc** made in the same stitch.



Left Ear

Make two identical pieces, one in Blue Jeans and the other in Lobelia.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring

Rnd 2: 1 sc, inc4, 2 sc, inc4, 1 sc [12]

Rnd 3: 1 sc, 3 inc, 3 sc, 3 inc, 2 sc [18]

Rnd 4: 1 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 3 sc,
(1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 2 sc [24]

Rnd 5: 1 sc, (2 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 3 sc,
(2 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 2 sc [30]

Rnd 6: 3 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 4 sc
Cut the yarn, and attach it again to the next stitch. The idea is to create a hole for Stitch's ear to be cut.

5 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 6 sc [36]

Rnd 7: 6 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 4 sc.
Cut the yarn, and attach it again at the next stitch.

8 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 6 sc [42]

Rnd 8: 7 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 6 sc.
Cut the yarn, and attach it again at the next stitch.

10 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, 7 sc [48]

Finish off the pink piece and do not finish off the blue piece.

Place the pink piece in front of the blue one and with the blue yarn make **sc** around the ear, joining the two pieces (in the same way as was done with the right ear).

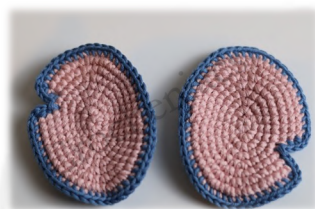

Pinch the tip of the ears as shown in Images 34 and 35. Insert the hook into the tip of the ear and pass it through so that it catches the **sc** on both sides of the piece. Attach the Blue Jeans yarn, and make **4 sc**. Leave a long thread for sewing.

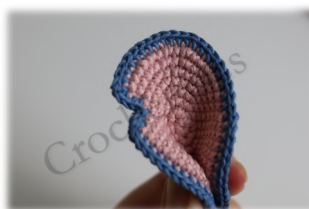

Assembly

Sew the head to the body. If you have any questions about how to sew, I recommend watching the tutorial on the YouTube channel. Note that in Images 40 to 42 the head is attached with pins. Use plenty of pins to secure the pieces before sewing. This step is very important so that the pieces do not move out of place during sewing.

Sew the ears to the side of the head, with the bottom of the ears being sewn between rounds 20 and 23, 1 sc away from the light portion of the eye. To keep the ears from hanging down, but rather close to the head, pass the needle through the blue (outer) part of the ear, sewing 1 stitch to the head (Images 52 and 53). Finish off.

Sew the paws between **rounds 6 and 9** of the body, **1 sc** away from the light colored portion in the middle of the body. Add stuffing as you close the seam.

Sew the arms between **rounds 15 and 16**, **2 sc** away from the light colored part on the body.

Sew the tail to the back of the body, between **rounds 5 and 9**. Remember to add stuffing as you close the piece.

Sew the snout between **rounds 16 and 20**, between the light colored parts on the face. Sew the hair on top of the head, where the magic ring was made.

The Hawaiian skirt was made with the color Pistachio. Make **37 chains**, and from the second chain from the hook make **36 sl st**. Make **1 chain** and turn the piece. Repeat the following sequence:

- I. **2 sl st, 5 chains** and **4 sc** from the second chain, **sl st** in the next stitch.
- II. **1 sl st, 4 chains** and **3 sc** from the second chain.

Leave a long thread to tie a knot at the back of the body, securing the skirt.

Details of the feet and arms

To make Stitch's nails, use Blue yarn and a tapestry needle. Pass the needle between **rounds 3 and 4** vertically twice. Do this **4 times** to form Stitch's toenails, and sew each toenail with a **2 sc** interval between them.

After passing the yarn vertically, pass it several times horizontally (Image 85) and finish off.

Do the same procedure on the arms, but passing the needle vertically between **rounds 2 and 3**.
